happy family.


They never fought with each other.

and in the fields.







But they were not allowed to go near a fire.

singing into the morning light.




They had to do all their work during

of wax!






But one of the boys longed to go out
in the sunlight.




They took their bird brother up to a

His brothers warned him...




But they made a plan. They shaped
