




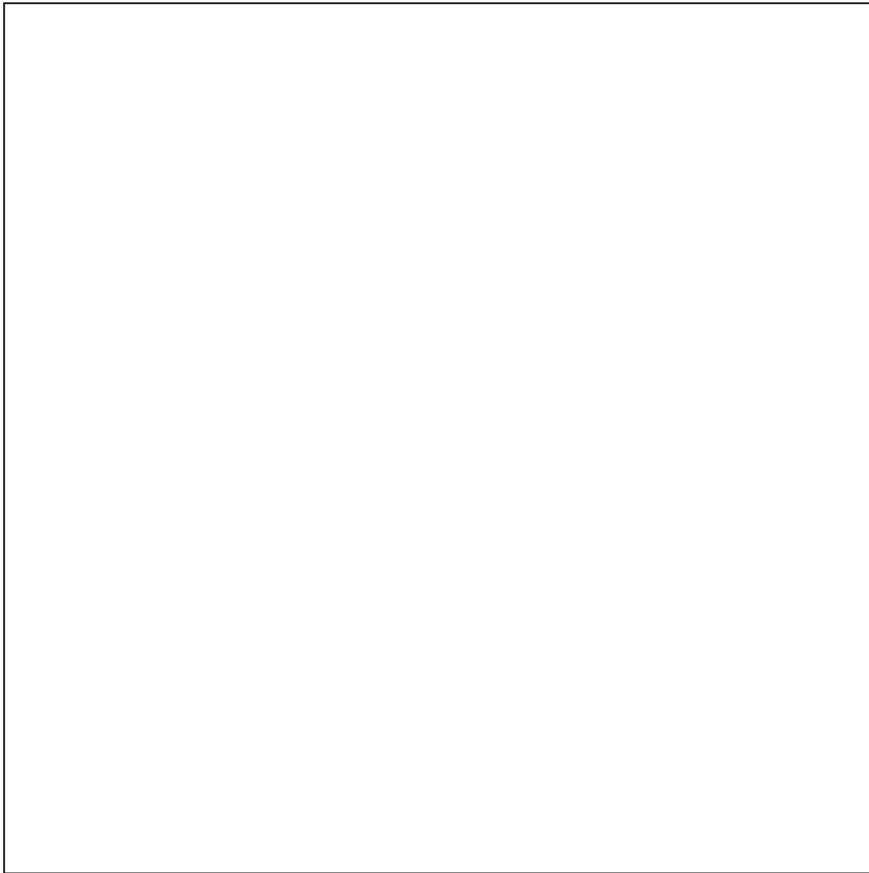
My little brother sleeps very late. I
wake early, because I am great!




I am the one who lets in the sun.




“You’re my morning star,” says
Ma.




I wash myself, I don't need any help.




I can cope with cold water and blue smelly soap.




Ma reminds, "Don't forget teeth." I
reply, "Never, not me!"




After washing, I greet Grandpa and Auntie, and wish them a good day.




Then I dress myself, "I'm big now
Ma," I say.




I can close my buttons and buckle my shoes.
